

2020 Quilt Show Categories – Quilts are made from at least 2 layers of fabric with a layer of batting between with the layers stitched or tied together.

Junior: A quilt made by someone 16 years of age or younger.

Lap/Crib/Bed Runner: A smaller quilt that's intended for use as a small bed quilt, lap quilt, crib or bed runner not to exceed 240" - total outside perimeter.

Bed Quilt: A quilt that is made to go on a bed with a perimeter of 241" or more – total outside perimeter.

Embroidered (all sizes): Pieces that are made up of/or its design encompasses at least 75% of machine embroidery.

Small Wall Hanging: A quilt that's intended for display on a wall, not to exceed 85" - total outside perimeters. Quilts that are considered miniature quilts are included in this category.

Medium Wall Hanging: A quilt that's intended for display on a wall, quilts must have a between 86" – 175" total outside perimeter.

Large Wall Hanging: A quilt that's intended for display on a wall, perimeter **over** 175".

Other Voting Categories

Wearable: Clothing, pocketbooks, totes (including but not limited to Jackets, coats, vests, etc.).

Other: Non-wearable's including lampshades, pillows, pin cushions, Christmas tree skirts, Penny rugs, stockings, pillows, etc.

Special Recognition: The BMQG Quilt Show Committee reserves the right to recognize a quilt based on outstanding workmanship or technique.

Definitions:

Quilt: Quilts are made from at least 2 layers of fabric with a layer of batting between with the layers stitched or tied together.

Perimeter: For a square or rectangular quilt: The combined measurement of all 4 exterior sides of a quilt. For a quilt that is not square or rectangular: The combined measurement of all 4 exterior sides of an imaginary square/rectangle that surrounds the quilt.
